## Appendix 1

## PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

The Citizens' Advisory Committee is comprised of citizens from the community who volunteer their time to act as advisors, objective observers, and community liaisons to the Correctional Service of Canada.

Application to the Citizens' Advisory Committee does not guarantee appointment. Current CSC employees, contractors and offenders are not eligible to apply.

All applicants are required to partake in an orientation/training session.

Applicants are appointed for a term of two years. Appointments are made by the Deputy Commissioner of the region from which the applicant is applying, based on recommendations from the Institutional Head or Parole Office Manager, and the involved Citizens' Advisory Committee.

Prior to approval, all applicants must undergo a security clearance.

At the end of this first two-year term, members *may* be re-appointed provided that the individual member, the Institutional Head or Parole Office Manager, and the Citizens' Advisory Committee are in mutual agreement.

All information obtained by members in the course of their duties must be held in strict confidence. Members will be expected to adhere to the same standards of confidentiality that apply to government employees under the *Privacy Act*.

Committee members are not advocates, but rather, informed and impartial observers, advisors and communication links to the community, the staff and management of federal facilities/parole offices, and to offenders.

### EXCERPT FROM COMMISSIONER'S DIRECTIVE 023 CITIZENS' ADVISORY COMMITTEES

#### POLICY OBJECTIVE

To foster positive relations with the community by engaging citizens in the development of policies and offender programs and to ensure that they are enriched by diverse perspectives.

# EXCERPTS FROM THE CORRECTIONS AND CONDITIONAL RELEASE ACT

### **Summary Conviction Offences**

- 45. Every person commits a summary conviction offence who:
  - (a) is in possession of contraband beyond the visitor control point in a penitentiary;
  - (b) is in possession of anything referred to in paragraph (b) or (c) of the definition "contraband" in section 2 before the visitor control point of a penitantian.
  - penitentiary:
    (c) delivers contraband to, or receives contraband from, an inmate;
  - (d) without prior authorization, delivers jewellery to, or receives jewellery from an inmate; or
  - (e) trespasses at a penitentiary.

### Searches of Visitors

- 59. A staff member may conduct routine non-intrusive searches or routine frisk searches of visitors, without individualized suspicion, in the prescribed circumstances, which circumstances must be limited to what is reasonably required for security purposes.
- 60.(1) A staff member may conduct a frisk search of a visitor where the staff member suspects on reasonable grounds that the visitor is carrying contraband or carrying other evidence relating to an offence under section 45.

#### NOTE: Contraband is defined as

- (a) an intoxicant,
- (b) a weapon or a component thereof, ammunition for a weapon, and anything that is designed to kill, injure or disable a person or that is altered so as to be capable of killing, injuring or disabling a person, when possessed without prior authorization,
- (c) an explosive or a bomb or a component thereof,
- (d) currency over any applicable prescribed limit, when possessed without prior authorization, and
- (e) any item not described in paragraphs (a) to (d) that could jeopardize the security of a penitentiary or the safety of persons, when that item is possessed without prior authorization.

## **CAUTION**

- (1) Under no circumstances may a visitor transport into the institution any prescription or non-prescription drug. All drugs in a visitor's possession shall be deposited in the security lockers provided prior to entry into the institution. All personal effects in the visitor's possession with the exception of worn jewellery, shall also be deposited in the lockers provided.
- (2) Under no circumstances will visitors transport or consume alcoholic beverages on penitentiary property.
- (3) All vehicles must be locked while on penitentiary property.
- (4) Volunteers may be refused entry if official identification is not available.
